

P R E F A C E.

THE Compiler, in presenting to his subscribers and the Citizens of Detroit generally the following work, the first of a series which he hopes to make annual, does so with satisfaction, though not unmixed with regret.

It is with satisfaction that the execution and general appearance of the Book are so well worthy of our thriving, enterprising city ; and regret that owing to the lateness of the season when it was commenced, it was not possible to make it as full and accurate as would have been desirable.

But when it is taken into consideration that but about six weeks was consumed in the collection and arrangement of the entire contents of the following pages, (the remainder of the time since the completion of the subscription list, having been lost in waiting the arrival of type,) and that it is nearly impossible to make such a work as correct the first year, as it may be in succeeding ones, when the first issue has been before the public, and opportunity has been had to discover and point out its inaccuracies, as also the fact that our population is an unusually mixed one, being composed of French, Irish, Germans, and Americans, and that it is difficult to engage the services of those who are sufficiently conversant with each, or either, to perfectly guard against errors in the spelling of the various names—when all these things are taken into consideration the Compiler, hopes to merit and to meet the indulgence of the public.

No pains were spared to make the statistical part of the work as complete and reliable as possible, and the list of names it is confidently believed will be found to contain the name of every householder who was in the City at the time the canvass was made. If any omissions are found it will prove to be of some who are boarding in private families, a fault which will be carefully guarded against another year, by gathering the names from every store, shop or other place of business, as well as from the residences.

The alphabetical arrangement of the names is thorough, extending the entire length of the name, and therefore if any name is not found in its proper place it may be supposed, unless mis-spelled, to have been inadvertently omitted.

The Compiler would thank any person for information where any mistakes occur in the spelling of names, in the business or residences, or in the statistical portion of the book.

Several new features may be looked for in the issue of another year which it was found impossible to insert in the present one, and every care will be taken to make it still more worthy of public patronage.

Their Works have been erected at an expense of \$112,000. Between five and six miles of pipe have been laid up to the present time.

RAIL ROADS.

MICHIGAN CENTRAL RAIL ROAD COMPANY.

This Company was chartered in the spring of 1846. In the autumn of that year, the Company had consummated the acceptance of the charter and the purchase of the road, by making their first payment to the State, in compliance with its terms. The Road, in the hands of the State, had been extended as far as Kalamazoo, 146 miles from Detroit, but was ironed with flat bar, and much of the Road was in bad order, and worn out. The new Company commenced extending the Road towards Lake Michigan, and re-laying the eastern portion of the old Road with heavy "T" rail.

In May, 1852, the Road was completed, and laid through the entire length with heavy T rail, from Detroit to Chicago, a distance of 280 miles.

The Company purchased in the City of Detroit about twenty-two acres of ground, when they commenced operations, most of it being under water. This they filled in to low-water mark, or to the edge of the channel, and erected thereon their buildings, &c., for the accommodation of the business at this end of the line.

They have on these premises upwards of twenty-six hundred feet of dock-front on the river, where vessels can lie in water from twelve to twenty feet deep. They have erected a large Freight Depot, one hundred feet wide, and extending eight hundred feet along the dock, upon the river. This building, in both stories, can store about one hundred thousand barrels of flour. Adjoining that is a Passenger Depot, three hundred and twenty-five feet long and seventy-five feet wide; in one end of which are the Ticket Office, Ladies' Room, Baggage Room, &c.; and up stairs, the Superintendent's and Treasurer's Offices, Engineer's Room, &c. Below the Freight Depot, on the river front, are two large two-story warehouses, capable of storing twenty-six thousand barrels of flour. The twenty-two acres are all inclosed by a fence, and have the river on one side for twenty-six hundred feet, and streets upon the other sides. In this inclosure is erected an Engine House, with sixteen stalls for engines. The building is circular, one hundred and thirty feet in diameter, surmounted with a dome eighty-five feet high. Connected with this, is a Machine and Blacksmith Shop, one hundred and sixty feet

long, sixty feet wide, and two stories high, in which are twenty-three blacksmiths' forges, furnished with blast from a fan run by a stationary engine. In the second story of this building, are a large number of lathes, planing machines, work benches, &c., for turning and planing iron, and repairing and fitting up machinery. This building and the Engine House are sufficiently capacious to give room for two hundred workmen. Adjoining these shops for iron work, is a large shop for building and repairing cars, one hundred and sixty-nine feet long, fifty-five feet wide, and two stories high, giving room sufficient for one hundred workmen. All the machinery in this shop and the Machine Shop, is driven by a large stationary engine, placed in a building between the two. There is also between the two a large Smoke Stack, thirteen feet square and one hundred and fifty feet high, by means of which all the smoke of the shops is carried off by under-ground flues. In the yard of this Company, there is also a Wheat Warehouse, upon the river front, one hundred and twenty feet by sixty, and seventy feet high. This is so arranged as to elevate the wheat from the cars into bins above, and spout it directly into the vessel lying along side the dock, without handling. There are also a Lumber House, a house for storing iron and materials, and some other smaller buildings. The buildings most of them are of brick, and fire-proof from without. The following is a tabular statement of all the buildings:

In the Spring of 1846, a few gentlemen, feeling the want of a suitable place for a public Cemetery, apart from the noise and bustle of the

city, and sufficiently remote to secure its inviolability, opened a subscription for the purpose of purchasing a proper site. They fixed upon a portion of the **GEORGE HUNT** Farm, in Hamtramck, about two miles from the city—then about to be offered for sale—as combining the advantages of a soil well adapted for the purpose of interment, picturesque situation, and capability of improvement. A sum was soon subscribed by the liberality of our citizens, sufficient to authorize the purchase of the requisite quantity of land. An association was formed of the subscribers, Trustees were appointed, and an agreement drawn up, submitted to, and approved by the parties interested, the provisions of which were to govern the proceedings of the Association, until a Charter could be obtained:

The Trustees purchased forty-two acres of the most picturesque portion of the Farm alluded to, at the cost of \$1,858 00. The land was enclosed by a substantial fence, drives and walks laid out, the ground surveyed into lots of proper dimensions, and a code of rules and regulations adopted. A house, in the English cottage style, was erected for the residence of the Superintendent, and a rural Cemetery established, under the name of **ELMWOOD CEMETERY**, which was opened for the interment of the dead, in October, 1846.

The affairs of the Cemetery were conducted under the above mentioned agreement, until the Trustees, deeming it advisable to provide for the present adornment, and future preservation of the Cemetery grounds on a more secure basis, obtained a Charter from the Legislature of this State.

In July, 1850, at a meeting of the Trustees, the Charter was formally accepted, and an election of officers held under its provisions, when

The printed rules and regulations, in reference to the Cemetery, heretofore made and adopted by the late Trustees, were adopted by the present Board, and now regulate and govern the Cemetery.

The accounts of the Treasurer were submitted to, audited and found correct by the Board; and the Trustees have the pleasure to announce that a balance remained on hand sufficient to pay the purchase money

of the land bought for the Cemetery. The money has been paid, and a deed obtained and recorded.

The Corporation is now out of debt, and the Trustees anticipate that the yearly income, from the sale of lots, will enable them to carry into effect, on an extended scale, their plans for embellishing and adorning the Cemetery, so as to render it a place of grateful resort to the friends of those who rest there, and an object of pride to the City of Detroit.

When the Cemetery was opened, a piece of ground was set apart and appropriated for the use of strangers, and persons whose means might not allow of their purchasing lots. Here single graves are procured at a moderate rate. The association being out of debt, the Trustees are now enabled to perform, what they have long considered a sacred duty, and they have decided, at their last meeting, to devote a portion of the income for the purpose of ornamenting and embellishing what is known as the "STRANGER'S LOT." The Executive Committee were, accordingly, authorized to obtain a marble shaft or obelisk, of suitable form, to be placed in said lot, and to make such other improvements therein, as they may deem expedient.

Since the opening of the Cemetery, four hundred and ninety-two interments have been made therein; of which one hundred and two are removals from other Cemeteries. The number of Lots sold is two hundred and eighty, and the number of Lot-holders is two hundred and ninety-four.

The Trustees remind the lot-holders and the public, that the whole future avails of the sales of lots, will be applied, conformably to the terms of the Charter, to the ornamenting and preservation of the Cemetery grounds; and, in conclusion, they would remark, that their own services have been, and are, entirely gratuitous. No one of the Trustees has received or intends to receive any compensation. They feel sufficiently compensated by the good fortune which has attended their efforts; the success of an enterprise, the prosperity of which they have closely at heart, and by the evident and increasing interest taken in the Cemetery, by all classes of the community, as shown by the more numerous application for Lots, and the care taken by the purchasers to beautify and adorn them.

The grounds of this Institution comprise about forty acres, and are situated about one mile from the City of Detroit, in the Township of

Hamtramck. They are beautifully placed on the highest land in this vicinity, and command fine and extensive views of the City and River of Detroit, and the surrounding country; the soil is well drained and admirably adapted for the purpose of interments. The various avenues (exclusive of walks) extend more than three miles.

The Cemetery is now open for the interment of the dead; applications for lots may be made to the Secretary of the Board of Trustees at his office, corner of Cass street and Jefferson Avenue, Daily (except Sundays) between 9 A.M. and 1 P.M., where a plan of the grounds and the prices of lots may be seen. The size of lots varies from fifteen by twenty feet to twenty by thirty, and the price from \$15 to \$100.

The rules and regulations governing Interments, Improvement of Lots, &c., are mainly similar to those adopted by the Corporations of Laurel Hill and Greenwood Cemeteries.

This association was the first, and has proved the most influential, of any literary organization in Detroit. About the 1st of January, 1833, now nineteen years since, a few educated young men who had then located themselves in this part of the west, met and organized themselves into a society, the object of which, in the words of their constitution, was "to promote the moral and intellectual improvement of the young men of Detroit." Their first meeting was held in the old Indian Council House, now occupied as the site of the new Firemen's Hall, on or near

the corner of Jefferson Avenue and Randolph street; and the first lecture before the association was delivered in that place by DOUGLASS HOUGHTON, M. D., now deceased. Upwards of five hundred members have, since that time, enrolled their names upon its records, and its subsequent influence upon them, and the general character of the society of the city, is universally admitted to have been eminently salutary and useful. On the 26th of March, 1836, the Society became regularly incorporated under an act of the Legislature of the State, and subsequently adopted, as the motto of their corporate seal, "*Virtuti et Litteris.*"

The exercises of the Society are continued only through the fall and winter months, and consist of debates upon literary, moral, political, and other topics, conducted by the members, and also of written lectures or discourses, which are alternately offered to the public one evening in every week. These debates are generally managed so as to bring before the community the discussion of some question or topic then agitating or engaging the public mind, and the lectures are generally the best productions of the best writers connected with the society.

There is also attached to the association a very handsome and well selected library, embracing all the important, and generally the most recent, works in the various fields of history, divinity, law, philosophy, and belles lettres; and to this library, the members are allowed weekly resort. They can now number upon their shelves about two thousand volumes, and continue to make further additions with each recurring year.

The society purchased two very desirable lots on Jefferson Avenue, near Randolph street, upon which they have erected a superb building, which is not only an ornament to the city, but also a source of great increase to both their members and their means. The building is forty-eight feet front on the Avenue, and ninety-five feet deep, is three stories high, and contains two spacious stores on the first floor, and an elegant hall upon the second, which is the one used by the society at its regular meetings. Over the hall are constructed appropriate library and committee rooms; and the whole forms a beautiful and highly valuable property.

Our citizens are requested to refer all applicants for relief, to any member of the Committee for the District in which the applicant resides.

Any member of a District Committee may, in urgent cases of destitution or sickness, afford relief to the value of not more than one dollar, without consultation with another member; but he may not dispense the Society's alms more than once to the same person or family, or to a greater amount than one dollar, without the concurrence of two members of a Committee.

The following extracts, from the report of a Committee of the Society, will show something of its operations and present condition:

There were, during the last winter and spring, from the commencement to the close of the Society's active operations, upwards of ninety families reported as being under its care; each of which, from time to time, according to the exigency of the case, has shared the benefits resulting from the organization of this Society, and in many instances have been saved from the evils of pauperism, and by the temporary aid received through this instrumentality, placed in a condition no longer requiring assistance.

The number of persons reported as sick, and requiring medical aid, during the period just referred to, was twenty-six. These were placed under the care, and received the attention of Dr. BATWELL, physician of the Society, which, in many cases involved a sacrifice both of time and labor, and which, as the compensation is but nominal, the Society can only repay by informing our citizens of his devotion and untiring energy on behalf of the sick poor who were referred to his care.

Nearly the whole amount of the receipts of the Society during the year 1849-'50, was expended; but, before the commencement of the season of 1850-'51, and previous to any action of the Society in relation to the replenishment of its treasury, a voluntary contribution was made in the various Episcopal, Congregational, Presbyterian, Baptist, and Methodist Churches, on Thanksgiving day, for the benefit of the Society,

by which the sum of \$218 19 was obtained, which, added to the balance (\$6 24) in the treasury, and the collections subsequently made from subscriptions on the part of our citizens, makes a total of \$734 74

The Society has thus far encountered little difficulty on account of its finances. The sympathies of a generous community have been liberally extended to us at all times; and it affords your Committee great pleasure, on behalf of the Society, thankfully to acknowledge the various instances of this liberality with which the Society has been favored during the past summer. The thanks of the Society are due to Madame BISHOP, who during her appearance in Detroit, voluntarily appropriated for its benefit, one-half of the gross receipts of one of her musical entertainments, amounting to \$128 50. And for the gratuitous use of the favorite steamer *Ocean*, voluntarily tendered by the Messrs. WARD, upon a pleasure excursion, realizing to the Society the sum of \$218 50, affording also a delightful hour of enjoyment to those who, under the escort of the gallant and courteous Capt. WILLOUGHBY, had the good fortune to participate in the festivities of that occasion, the Society take this opportunity of expressing their most grateful acknowledgements.

The proceeds from these objects, added to the balance remaining in the treasury, amount to \$432 83, being the amount of money now on hand, with which the Society will commence its labors for the ensuing year.

Another very desirable addition to our present system, is the establishment of a House of Industry, which as an auxiliary, under the auspices of the Society, would, in the opinion of your Committee, render our organization most complete.

By the system of police visitation adopted by the Society, the real condition and wants, as also the character and worthiness of all who apply for relief are made known; and, acting in concert with the efficient Superintendent of the poor, the many systems of imposition which

are sought to be practiced by unworthy persons upon our citizens at their own doors, may be prevented.

Street-begging should, and it is believed will, be entirely abandoned. There is certainly now no excuse for any persons, however miserable and destitute they may be, passing from door to door among us, craving relief. In order, however, to carry out this desirable end, it is highly important that our citizens should again be reminded of the necessity of their co-operation with the Society, in rejecting all applications made by strangers for relief, and referring them directly to the proper Committee who has charge of their particular District.

In conclusion, your Committee have only to say, that the experience of the Society, thus far, demonstrates beyond all contingency, that if the detail of their organization and plan of labor, are but fairly and fully carried out, by both its own members and our citizens generally, the evils of street-begging will soon cease, and the ills of poverty among those of our poor who are thus honestly afflicted, at least much alleviated, if not wholly removed; in which result, we doubt not this Society will receive the sincere congratulations of a discerning public.

"Regarding the virtue and intelligence of a community as the only sure basis of its prosperity, and believing that harmony of sentiment and charity, to the unfortunate, are necessary to its happiness; believing, also, that our united exertions are necessary to preserve proper standing in society, and oppose the progress of vicious principles and individual misconduct, we," &c., &c.

The Society numbers about sixty members, and is in a prosperous condition, with an income of over \$300 per annum and a choice Library of over one thousand three hundred volumes.

The Librarian attends, every Saturday evening, at the Library, where books may be drawn by all regular members. The Mechanics' Hall is situated on lots seventeen and eighteen, south side of Lafayette street, west, and in rear of the Baptist Church. Meetings are held quarterly. Initiation fee \$5. Dues one dollar per annum, which entitles members to all the privileges of the Society; and it is the very place where the mechanic and apprentice can store his mind with a large portion of all that has been published upon the Arts and Sciences.

The Asylum building is situated in the upper part of Jefferson Avenue.

The object of the Association is the maintenance and education of destitute orphan children, principally such as have lost both parents, one of the parents having been a resident of Detroit at the time of his or her death.

The managers have power to extend the benefits of the institution to other orphan children, at their discretion.

No child is admitted into the Asylum until it shall have attained its second year, (though the managers may, at their discretion, extend aid to such as are younger,) nor continue in it after the completion of its twelfth year.

ST. MARY'S HOSPITAL.

UNDER CHARGE OF THE SISTERS OF CHARITY.

This institution has been in operation but a few years. It was mainly built by contributions, and is supported by charitable donations from our citizens. The building, situated on Clinton street, between St. Antoine and Hastings, is eighty-seven feet long by fifty-four feet deep, three and a half stories (sixty feet) high, and is capable of accommodating one hundred and fifty patients. The wants of the sick are administered to by nine Sisters of Charity, under direction of a Superior, Sister CHRYSOSTOM.

LADIES OF THE SACRED HEART.

Academy on Jefferson Avenue, conducted by the Ladies of this Order, from the Mother House in Montreal.

This establishment is designed for the education of young ladies in the highest branches of female education and accomplishment.

BROTHERS OF THE CHRISTIAN SCHOOLS.

Residence on Larned street, in rear of the Cathedral. The School of the Brothers is in rear of St. Anne's Church, and contains four hundred scholars. That of St. Mary's Church contains three hundred, and Trinity Church, two hundred and fifty to three hundred scholars. These Schools are free.

GUILDS OF SS. PETER AND PAUL, AND JUVENILE GUILD OF THE HOLY FAMILY.

Attached to the Cathedral. The object of the Guild establishments is mutual aid in sickness, temporal and spiritual, and stricter enforcement of moral and religious precepts.

SISTERS OF NOTRE DAME.

Principal College at Hamtramck will shortly be opened.

ST. VINCENT'S ORPHAN ASYLUM AND SCHOOL.

This institution has recently been enlarged by the erection of a fine brick building, three stories high, fronting on Larned street. Twenty-four orphans are now maintained and educated. The School attached to the Asylum contains one hundred and fifty pupils.

The Temple of Honor was brought into existence by prominent Sons of Temperance, and designed by them for a branch of their own Order. The objects proposed were : To strengthen the fraternal relations of the brotherhood ; to afford additional benefits, without uniting with other organizations where total abstinence was not regarded as a fundamental principle ; and to render the beneficial system progressive in moral and intellectual requirement. But, at the same time, *temperance* was the great distinguishing characteristic—the promotion of the temperance cause the leading, governing object of the institution. It was thought that such an addition would adapt the Order to the wants of all the friends of temperance, and give greater interest and permanency to the reformation.

The first Temple was organized in New York city, December 5, 1845 ; the first Grand Temple (that of New York) February 21, 1846.

There are, at present, Grand Temples in fifteen States, and subordinate Temples in every State in the Union, except Vermont, South Carolina and California. They are also located in two British provinces.

The great, governing object is *the promotion of the temperance cause*. The pledge taken by every brother is, that he will abstain from the use of all alcoholic beverages *during life*; and, in addition to this, use all honorable means in his power to *prevent their manufacture or use*, or *the traffic in them*.

Believing that virtue is the only true basis of friendship, all our ceremonies teach, and laws require the practice of a high morality. The belief in the existence of a God, and our accountability to him, are prerequisite conditions to membership. "Love to God, our country and our fellow man," are characteristics of every worthy Templar. These truths and principles are illustrated and enforced by pleasing and attractive ceremonies, and the most solemn requirements.

In addition to the initiatory Degree, three other Degrees are established, the object of which is to perfect the brethren in the principles, precepts and workings, of the Order—each successive Degree inculcating higher and still higher moral precepts.

The crowning grace of the Temple, however, is the Social Degree, where woman, whose province heretofore has been to "suffer and to wait," can join hands with us in our labor of love. Here father and mother, sister and brother, husband and wife, son and daughter, can all unite in one great family, having the same object in view, and consult together on the best means of attaining that object. All Templars in good standing, and all ladies of good moral character, are eligible to this Degree.

The Temple of Honor is also a beneficial organization. The receipts are ample, if properly cared for, to secure the promised benefits. The usual fees and dues of the Temples now in operation are as follows: Initiation, \$5; Dues, \$4 per year; Degrees, including Social Degree, \$9. The benefits are: in sickness, \$3 per week. On the Death of a brother, \$25 are appropriated for a funeral benefit; on the death of a brother's wife, \$15. These are slightly varied, but are about the average rates.

MECHANIC'S MUTUAL PROTECTION.

This is a Society of Mechanics, organized by secret initiation, and allowing benefits in case of sickness. It is a branch of a general organization, intended to unite the Mechanics throughout the United States. The object is to encourage education among the Mechanics, and to elevate their social and political condition.

The Society was organized on the 3d of May, 1849. Meetings every Tuesday evening at $7\frac{1}{2}$ o'clock, over 66, Jefferson Ave., corner Cass street.

PUBLIC BUILDINGS.

UNITED STATES BUILDING.

Corner of Jefferson Avenue and Griswold street.

This is a handsome building, fifty-seven by forty feet square. The architecture is of the chaste Grecian style, the two fronts being composed of polished stone. It is occupied as the United States Court Room and Marshal's Office, with offices for District Judge and Clerk. In the basement are the United States Land Office and the Receiver's Office.

STATE BUILDING.

East side of Griswold street, first above Fort.

This is a plain, substantial brick building, fifty-six feet front by forty feet deep. The Court of Chancery and the Supreme Court hold their sessions in this building.

WAYNE COUNTY BUILDING.

Corner of Congress and Griswold streets.

This is a two-story brick building, thirty-two feet front by eighty feet deep, erected in 1844. The first story is occupied as offices by the dif-

ferent County Officers, and the second story contains a Court, Jury, and Grand Jury rooms.

CITY HALL.

Woodward Avenue, fronting Campus Martius.

This is a two-story brick building, with hammered stone basement, and is one hundred feet long and fifty feet wide. The principal entrance is from the public square. In the first story are the City Market and Clerk's Office. The second story is occupied as the Common Council Room, and by the offices of the City Clerk, Treasurer, Auditor, and Surveyor, and by the Commissioner of Water Works and Director of the Poor.

HYDRAULIC WORKS.

Foot of Orleans street, on the river.

The tank or reservoir which contains the water, is of cast iron, sixty feet in diameter and twenty feet deep, secured with strong iron bands, bolts, and rivets, inclosed with a frame building, sixty-five feet in diameter, twenty-four feet high, and supported by a circular brick building, sixty-two feet in diameter, at an elevation of forty-seven feet from its foundation.

ODD FELLOWS' HALL.

West side of Woodward Avenue, between Larned and Congress sts.

This edifice was built in 1846 by an association of Odd Fellows, receiving a charter from the State for that purpose, and measures fifty-two feet in front by eighty feet deep. On the ground floor are two stores, the entrance to the upper part of the building being by a wide flight of stairs from the centre of the front. The second floor is occupied by lawyers', physicians', and other offices. The third story is wholly occupied by Mr. Uriah Gregory's Commercial College. The fourth story is reserved for the exclusive use of the Fraternity, containing, besides two small rooms, two ante-rooms, each twenty feet square, and a Lodge room, measuring thirty-eight by forty feet, and eighteen in height, surmounted by a massive dome, ten feet in diameter and sixteen in height. The Lodge room has been pronounced by many who have visited the principal Lodge rooms in the Union, as inferior to none at the time of its completion, and excelled at the present time by only one or two in the country.

YOUNG MEN'S SOCIETY BUILDING.

Jefferson Avenue, between Bates and Randolph streets.

This is a handsome brick building, forty-four feet by ninety-five, ornamented with bracketed caps to the windows, and a fine bracketed cornice to correspond. The lower part of the building is occupied by two fine stores, between which is the entrance to the Hall above. The Hall of the Society is forty-three feet wide by seventy feet in length, and twenty-two feet high, lighted by large windows in the rear and a dome from above. It is used for lectures and debates, and also rented for a concert room, and is at present occupied on the Sabbath by the Tabernacle Baptist Church. It is finished with pilasters with ornamented capitals, and with a handsome cornice. The room is splendidly lighted with gas. The library room is of large dimensions, in the third story front.

FIREMEN'S HALL.

Corner of Jefferson Avenue and Randolph street.

This is a building of the Anglo-Tuscan style of architecture, erected by the Fire Department of the City of Detroit. It is sixty feet front by one hundred deep, and three stories high. It is divided as follows: The first story into two large stores, with a spacious entrance in the centre, leading to the second and third floors. The second floor contains eight offices and a large concert room; and on the third floor, is a magnificent Hall, with dressing rooms, &c., attached, for the use of the Fire Department. The Hall is lighted with gas.

MARKETS.

There are but two Market buildings—the CITY MARKET, on the first floor of the City Hall, and the WASHINGTON MARKET, on the corner of Wayne and Larned streets. These are kept in good order by the Inspector of Provisions, and well supplied with every thing that can be desired at similar places. There is a great variety of vegetables and fruit in season, and also of fish, the latter of which is found in great abundance in the river—all of which are to be had in the FRUIT MARKET adjacent to the City Hall, which is now covered in, and inclosed with a strong fence.

MUSEUM OF CURIOSITIES.

B Y D R . C A V A L L I .

South side of Franklin street, east of St. Antoine.

The Museum of Dr. CAVALLI, as above, is open daily for the reception of visitors, citizens and strangers, where may be inspected an interesting and extensive collection of objects, the works of Nature and Art.

Here may be seen a most complete collection of Minerals, three hundred specimens, from the different locations on Lake Superior, from the Valley of the Mississippi, the States of Georgia and Massachusetts, and from the Niagara Group; splendid specimens of agates from Oberstein, in Germany; Rocks and Minerals from the Fichtelgebirg in Bavaria, Saxony, Bohemia, Tyrol, the Rhine, Helvetia, Hungaria, Norway, Sweeden, Iceland, Siberia, Ural and Australia.

A collection of specimens of Organic Remains, from Lakes Huron and Erie, Lockport, Georgia; also, of the Eifel, on the Rhine, and the Schlakenwall, in Bohemia. The series of Filsbites, the most ancient animal remains before the flood. Shells from the Atlantic, Pacific, and Indian Oceans; Bivalves from the Western Rivers, the great inland Seas, from Bavaria, Holstein, and the Rhine. The Horn Shell, (*Unio Spinosa*), from Georgia, is a very rare specimen.

Among the works of Art are the splendid representations of the Flore de l'Amateur, the Birds, Quadrupeds, and Nests of the Birds from Schintz, after the system of Cuvier. The Zoologique Atlas of Egypt, the antiquities of Herculanæum, the Sculptures of Rome, from Sandrat, a precious work of five hundred Engravings. Topography of Europe, by Merian, two hundred years old, with maps and views of the Cities. The representation of the Coat of Arms from all the Sovereigns, Princes, Republics, Cities, and the Nobility of Europe, ten thousand arms.

The celebrated men of the Fourteenth and Eighteenth Centuries, represented in a series of one thousand four hundred medals, Napoleon's Campaign in Italy; the most interesting Engravings of modern artists, from the classic paintings of Rafael, Davini, Correggio, as Madoma di St. Sisti, the Last Supper, Magdalena, and Napoleon and his Marshals, Adieu de Fontainbleau, Retour d'Elbe, &c., &c.

The collection of Medals contains the interesting series of Napoleon's reign, and a complete collection of all the Kings of France from Pha-

ramond to the present Republican Government, and also the splendid medal of the Translation of Napoleon's remains to the Invalids.

The Antiquities consist of a collection of Roman curiosities from Herculaneum and Pompeii, collected by a gentleman of the highest standing at the time the Dr. visited Italy.

The Antiquities of the Aborigines are composed of very ancient utensils. The following is the order in which the different scientific objects are arranged:

HISTORY AND STATISTICS.

I have been permitted to make the following extract from the early history of Detroit, published in our last Directory, two years since:

The history of Detroit is most intimately connected with the history of the whole north-west, as its settlement dates among the first on the American Continent. Founded in the strife for sovereignty between the English and French Governments, it became, at an early day, a point of central influence, importance, and action. "No place in the United States," it has been observed, "presents such a series of events, interesting in themselves, and permanently affecting, as they occurred, its progress and prosperity. Five times its flag has been changed; three different sovereigns have claimed its allegiance, and since it has been held by the United States, its government has been thrice transferred; twice it has been besieged by the Indians, once captured in war, and once burned to the ground." It dates back to the landing of the Pilgrims, and was then a stopping place for the *couriers du bois*. Its legitimate settlement, however, was in 1701. Fort Gratiot and Sault Ste. Marie had been previously located. This whole region, from its first discovery until 1762, was under the dominion of France, to which it was bound by a chain of forts, stretching from the Gulf of St. Lawrence to the Mississippi River. With the victory of WOLFE, and the fall of Quebec, these forts passed into the hands of Great Britain, by whom a portion of them were surrendered to the United States, agreeably to the capitulation of Montreal.

In 1787, the North-West Territory was established, agreeably to the provisions of an ordinance drawn for that purpose by NATHAN DANE, of Beverly, Mass., according to which, not less than three, nor more than five States were to be carved out of it. The latter number has been erected and admitted into the Union, Wisconsin being the youngest.

In 1805, Michigan was erected into a Territory, and WILLIAM HULL

appointed Governor, with a Judiciary, and a government was organized at Detroit in July of that year. He found the town little more than a scene of ruins, it having been laid in ashes, the month previous, by a destructive fire. Shortly after this, an act of Congress was passed, directing the Governor and Judges, then exercising legislative powers, to lay out a new town, including the site of the old town destroyed, and ten thousand acres of adjacent land. Advantage was taken of this opportunity, to widen the streets, and lay out the city on an entirely new and enlarged plan. The old town occupied a site below the centre of the present town, and, we believe, was bounded on the east by Griswold street. It was built entirely of wood, and the streets were narrow, being economized to diminish the circuit of the stockade by which it was secured, or surrounded. The Indians, about this time, were preparing for a second assertion of their rights of sovereignty, which they had failed in, forty years before, under PONTIAC. They were now, however, enlisted in the interest of the British, whose purposes were advanced by several of the western tribes. The Shawnee Prophet, and his brother TECUMSEH, a worthy successor of the fearless PONTIAC, were their active leaders. Hostilities commenced on the Tippecanoe in 1811. In the following year, Detroit was surrendered into the hands of the enemy by Gen. HULL, and retaken by the American army in 1813. Late in the autumn of that year, the Territory was re-organized by the appointment of Gen. LEWIS CASS as Governor, which office he held until 1831, when he was called into Gen. JACKSON's Cabinet. He was succeeded by Mr. PORTER, of Pennsylvania. In 1837, the Territory was admitted into the Union as a State, and STEVENS T. MASON elected first Governor, before he was twenty-five years of age.

The act of Congress, after the conflagration of June, 1805, directed that a lot should be granted to every owner or occupant of a house in the old town, and the proceeds of the remainder applied to the erection of a Court House and Jail. The Govornor and Judges, who laid out the new town under that act, seemed to anticipate the future importance of the city, and to their good taste and judgment, are we indebted for the reserve of the Grand Circus, Campus Martius, and other public grounds and parks. By another act, passed by the Governor and Judges, Oct. 4, 1815, Detroit was incorporated as a city. By this act, the municipal authority was vested in five Trustees, a Secretary, an Overseer, a Collector, and a City

Marshal, who were to be chosen on the first day in May, annually, by the freeholders or householders of the city, paying an annual rent of \$40, and such other persons, who should be admitted to the freedom of the corporation, by a majority of the electors at their annual meeting. The original act of incorporation was suspended in 1824, by a new charter from the Legislative Council, which has since undergone so many alterations, that scarcely a vestige of its original provisions remains. The charter election is now held on the first Monday in March. No property qualification is required to constitute a "freeman" of the city, and all law-abiding persons are admitted to the "freedom of the corporation" without a vote of the majority of the electors at their annual meetings.

The area of the city has been enlarged at different periods, until its corporate limits now embrace three thousand three hundred and sixty-eight acres of land, of which nine hundred, lying south of Adams Avenue, are densely populated. The last addition to the city limits was the Eighth Ward, on the west side, in 1848.

Detroit is a port of entry, and the great commercial mart of the State. By her natural position in connection with navigation and commerce, she is destined to be one of the largest cities in the north-west.

THE PAST FEW YEARS.

There has been, unquestionably, no period in the history of Detroit, so strongly marked with unmistakable signs of rapid growth and permanent prosperity as have been the past three or four years.

There has been a larger amount of capital invested in the improvement of Real Estate and in extending the facilities of all branches of business, mechanical as well as mercantile, than has ever before been known in the like period of time.

A walk through our two main arteries of business, will impress this very forcibly upon the mind of the most casual observer, not only in the altered condition of the thoroughfares themselves, but in viewing the splendid buildings and the solid blocks of mammoth Stores, combining all the grace, elegance and convenience, with the strength and durability, which mark the present improved methods of the construction of such buildings in our first Cities.

Every resident of the City, for the past six years, must recollect the time when most of our streets were, at certain seasons of the year,

almost impassable, either for teams or foot passengers; when Detroit and mud were very nearly synomymes, and our Hotels were a by-word and a reproach, and when we could not point to an unbroken front of substantial brick stores on a single square in the City.

But now how changed the scene. Our main business streets solidly paved, rendered passable and serviceable, for years to come, and their sides lined with Hotels which will vie with those in many Cities boasting a much larger and much richer population than our own, and with stores which would seem literally transported from the great emporium itself.

And who does not remember the time when the "City Hall" was our "Ne Plus Ultra" for a Concert Room, and when, if we were to have a Ball, the dining hall of one of our Hotels had to be engaged. But now few Cities of our size can show two as fine Halls as our Firemen's and Young Men's Hall.

Then, too, the business of our Merchants was confined almost wholly to the retail trade, and not one was engaged exclusively in jobbing. Now, however, the dealer from the interior may well debate the advantage of going to the seaboard for his goods, when he sees the preparations made by our jobbers for his supply, and the inducements held out for him to purchase here. In any line of trade whatever, a stock may be laid in here on as favorable terms as the same can be obtained in New York, Boston or elsewhere, and brought to this place.

But the increase and improvement are by no means confined to the mercantile part of the City alone. But a few years since hardly an engine was heard to puff save it was from the boats passing and repassing through the river, while now, in all parts of the City, and in some portions, in almost every square, may be heard the patient and never-tiring click, click of the iron drudge, hastening and perfecting the work of artisans in every line of mechanical business.

Nor have these heavy outlays of Capital been confined within the limits of our City. Plank Roads have been constructed until there is not an outlet in any direction into the country that is not rendered, at all seasons, a useful and practicable mode of ingress or egress to the Farmer, the Business man, or the pleasure seeker.

At the same time much has been done by many of our enterprising citizens in developing the Mineral resources of the Northern Peninsula,

and the Copper and Iron trade of Lake Superior bids fair soon to become one of the richest sources of income to our State; better far than the golden wealth of California, as it carries with it but little of that wild exhilaration, so calculated to lead to all manner of excesses, which most peculiarly marks the mania for gold digging.

Smelting works, for the preparation of the Copper ore for market, have been erected a little below the City, on the banks of the river, which are now in full blast, evincing the sagacity and foresight of those engaged in the enterprise in seeking thus early to secure within our own limits the profits arising from this branch of the business, while at the same time it gives employment to so many more of our own inhabitants.

And, last, though by no means least, I would mention the very marked improvement of the lower part of the City, (though effected mainly by foreign capital,) in the reclamation from the dominion of the river of a large piece of ground, and in the erection of the numerous buildings of the Michigan Central Rail Road Company, thereby adding much to the business appearance of that section, and forming a nucleus around which much other business naturally gathers.

The erection of the Gas Works is also the work of the last two years, and, while its buildings and grounds are an ornament to the street on which they stand, all parts of the City are favored with its nightly illuminings in place of the dismal fire-flies which were wont to serve no earthly purpose, unless it were, in some sort, to mark the course of the streets on which they stood.

Here too, as in the upper part of the City, we see the continuation and extension of the lumbering business, which, though always heavy here, has yet much increased and still more improved.

And all this has been done while our main article of export, Flour, has borne a lower continuous price, at least for the last two years, than has ever been usual before, and when the California emigration has been steadily draining our State of large sums of ready money. Yet it is by no means an unhealthy expansion of trade which we see around us, or one likely to end in the commercial overthrow of those engaged in it.

On the contrary, business of all kinds has steadily advanced to meet all its increased facilities, and, notwithstanding the great number of stores and dwellings erected during the past three years, there was never

a time when there was more demand for them, or when they would pay a better interest on the capital invested in them.

Unquestionably no Western City can produce a class of business men who conduct their operations on a more liberal scale and at the same time on as safe a basis. Failures from over-extension of business or from any and all other causes combined are more seldom witnessed here than in most other places in this western country.

On the whole we may well feel proud of our progress and our present position, and we may safely invite the Eastern Capitalist to our City to find reliable and profitable investments for his surplus funds; while the whole of our beautiful peninsula offers to the man of moderate means and to the exile from other lands a secure and happy home and abundant facilities for rendering himself and family comfortable, and even independent.

Great care was taken in the collection of the materials for the above table. So far as the visiting of every house within the corporation limits, and the asking of necessary questions are concerned, the compiler is able to vouch for its correctness. Yet, from the fears entertained by many of our citizens, that the Census I was taking was to be the basis of taxation, there is reason to believe that the total amount given is not

a full representation of our real population. The footings of the different columns themselves afford a strong argument in favor of such a belief, as by them it will be seen that those of both sexes under the age of twenty-one, exceed those at and above that age by only about two hundred, which is by no means a sufficient disparity between the two, if we allow thirty years to be a correct average of the duration of life in cities. From my own observation I am inclined to think that an addition of twelve or fifteen hundred will more nearly do justice to our City.

There are not included in the above table, any but actual residents of the city, though there are, on an average, from 800 to 1,000 persons in the city, at all seasons of the year, who are here for two or three months together. This would give us the following as a more exact enumeration:

This amount of property consists of houses of public worship, United States, State, County, and City property.

It will be seen by the above, that the rate of taxation is about two cents and six and a half mills on the dollar. This appears, at first sight, very high; but, when we take into consideration the amount of improvements effected, in the construction of sewers, the erection of the gas lights, and the paving of the Campus Martius and Grand Circus, all of which are paid for as they are completed, together with the payment of interest on the City debt, and the sum set aside toward a sinking fund for the extinguishing of the same, and, further, the acknowledged low valuation of property, it will not be found higher than might have been expected, or than will tend to the best interests of property-holders in the City.

Through the politeness of the City Clerk, Col. MUNGER, I have been

THE BUSINESS OF DETROIT.

It was my intention to have furnished a full and accurate statement of the amount of the business transactions of our Merchants for the past year or two, but owing to the unfavorable season when the work was commenced, I have been unable to ascertain the actual amount in figures. As most of our Merchants close up their yearly business about the first of January, in the succeeding year, and as they are generally, at this season, (August,) too much engaged, in the hurry and bustle of trade, to furnish accounts of their past year's operations, it was not deemed advisable to attempt to collect the items. Could they have been so collected they would most certainly have shown a very large increase over any former year. No one can doubt this who has been familiar with the business of our City for any length of time.

When we see the great increase in the number of stores, both wholesale and retail, and the greatly increased capacity of the stores themselves, with the fact that they are being constantly filled or replenished, we must conclude that our trade is largely increasing, although the two main dependencies of our Farmers, Wheat and Wool, have borne an unusually low price for the past two seasons. The amount of Wool that has been purchased by our Merchants, during the season just closed, from data gathered from individual buyers, is one million one hundred and two thousand five hundred pounds, which speaks exceedingly well for the Wool trade of our City. Much of this was purchased in the country, but it was all purchased by, and passed through the hands of our City Merchants and buyers. Much interest is evidently felt by our Farmers in improving the quality of their fleece, as is evidenced by the great number of imported sheep that have been brought into the State; and we may look for a finer exhibition in this department, at our annual State Fair, to be held in September, of the present year, (1852,) than has ever been witnessed before.

The following extract from the report of the Directors, to the Stockholders of the Michigan Central Rail Road Company, will give some idea of the present trade of our City and State, together with what we may expect in the future from the completion of the chain of communication between the Atlantic States and the Mississippi river:

"We present you herewith the Reports of Mr. UPTON, Treasurer, and of Mr. BROOKS, Superintendent and Engineer, giving details of the ope-

rations of their several departments, for the year ending 31st May, 1852. You will see that our gross receipts have been—

When our Dividend was declared last December, we had reserved from our Income fund about \$57,000, and had every reason, from the large amount of produce reported to be in the interior, to expect a large increase of business during the winter and spring.

The severe winter and the opening of the Lakes five or six weeks later than last year, together with the falling off in the amount of breadstuffs brought forward, have proved serious drawbacks to our last six months' receipts.

The accident to the "May Flower" has cost, in addition to the first estimate, say \$40,000
The carpenter's shop burned has cost, say 20,000

making our income fund, say \$60,000 short of what we had a right to expect.

We call attention to this statement, because we think it the true policy of the Company to make only such Dividends as will leave a reasonable

surplus on hand for contingencies, and the result proves that our reserve was sufficient to *meet* the combination of unfavorable circumstances, although it leaves us with a very small surplus at the moment.

On the other hand, the manifest economy in working the Road, which has grown out of its gradual improvement and of our increased experience, indicates an advance that is independent of accident.

With our heavy iron all laid, our track improved by the large amount of graveling done, (in addition to that of previous years,) our machinery in good order, and our route widely advertised by the large numbers who have passed over it, we are in a strong position for any competition which the coming season may bring to us.

Passing to matters of more practical interest, we have the satisfaction of informing you that we have succeeded, in spite of many obstacles, in completing our connection with Chicago, a city destined to become the converging point of the passengers from the whole Northwest, and from a large portion of the West.

The principal Illinois Roads are pressing towards this point with great vigor, and their early completion may be counted upon as certain.

A few months hence St. Louis will be connected with our line by one or more Roads, and the Mobile and Ohio Company are quietly but efficiently pushing their work towards Cairo, where possibly in two years, and certainly in four, they will complete their connection with the North.

The arrangements of the New Albany Road from the Ohio to Michigan City, are now made, and we may count on more or less benefit from this connection, within the year.

Still more important to us is the now certain success of the Great Western Road; all that men and money and skill can do, may be relied

on, to push that great work through; and while we are led to hope that it may be finished within a year from this time, we consider it practically certain that it will be in full operation from Niagara River to Windsor before the Winter of 1853-4—thus leaving us shut up but one more winter.

To appreciate the value of these works to us, it is only necessary to look to the tables of winter earnings for several years back.

A glance at them will show that the moment Lake Erie closes, Michigan becomes isolated from the seaboard, and our Railroad traffic is instantly reduced to about the amount of our operating expenses, and sometimes even lower, until the melting ice sets us free again.

It is difficult to say how much of this effect is produced by the execrable winter highways across the fertile plains of Illinois, but with these tables before us, who can doubt that when both obstructions are removed by the completion of the Railroads making, we shall commence an entirely new era in our winter business?

We are fully aware that everywhere Railroad traffic is materially checked during the severity of the season; but where else do we see the earnings of a Road fall, as ours have, from the earnings of October of the years 1848, 1849, 1850, 1851, when they averaged \$140,000 to such earnings as the months of December, January, February and March, of the years 1849, 1850, 1851, 1852 show, being only about, per month, 25,000 while they rise again in May of the corresponding years to an average of \$120,000 being nearly five times the monthly earnings of the winter months.

When it is considered that the Lake is usually open during part of December, and sometimes during part of March, the comparison becomes still more striking. Of the 400,000 emigrants which it is supposed now reach this country annually, a large share settle in Illinois, Wisconsin, Iowa, Minnesota and Missouri, which States are sure, before many years, to be interlaced with Railways, all more or less contributory to our line; and when the thrifty farmers of these States can leave their houses at the leisure season, after the ground is closed by frost, and in a few hours visit the Atlantic States, whence so many of them have emigrated, who can estimate the extent of this entirely new source of business?

Thirty-three hours will then suffice to take a passenger from Chicago

to New York. Ten hours more should include the inhabitants along the Mississippi, and a day's travel from beyond the banks of that river should bring in those on the present outskirts of our settlements, while three days ought to be enough to travel *over our route* from Mobile and New Orleans to New York or Boston.

With such prospects, rapidly becoming realities, it is well worth while to consider whether the price which our stock commands in the market shows a just appreciation of its intrinsic value."
