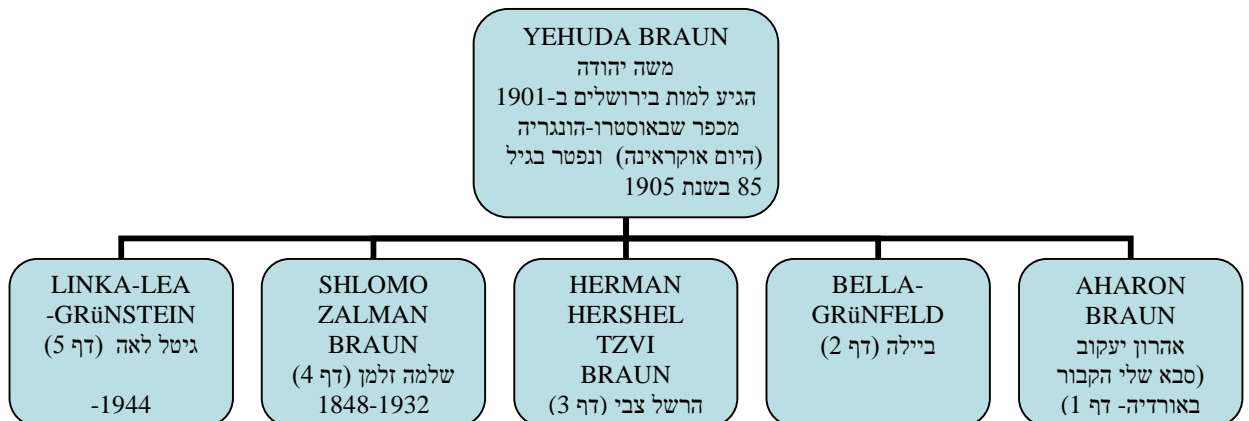
## עץ שורשים – קרובים מדרגה שנייה מצד אמי

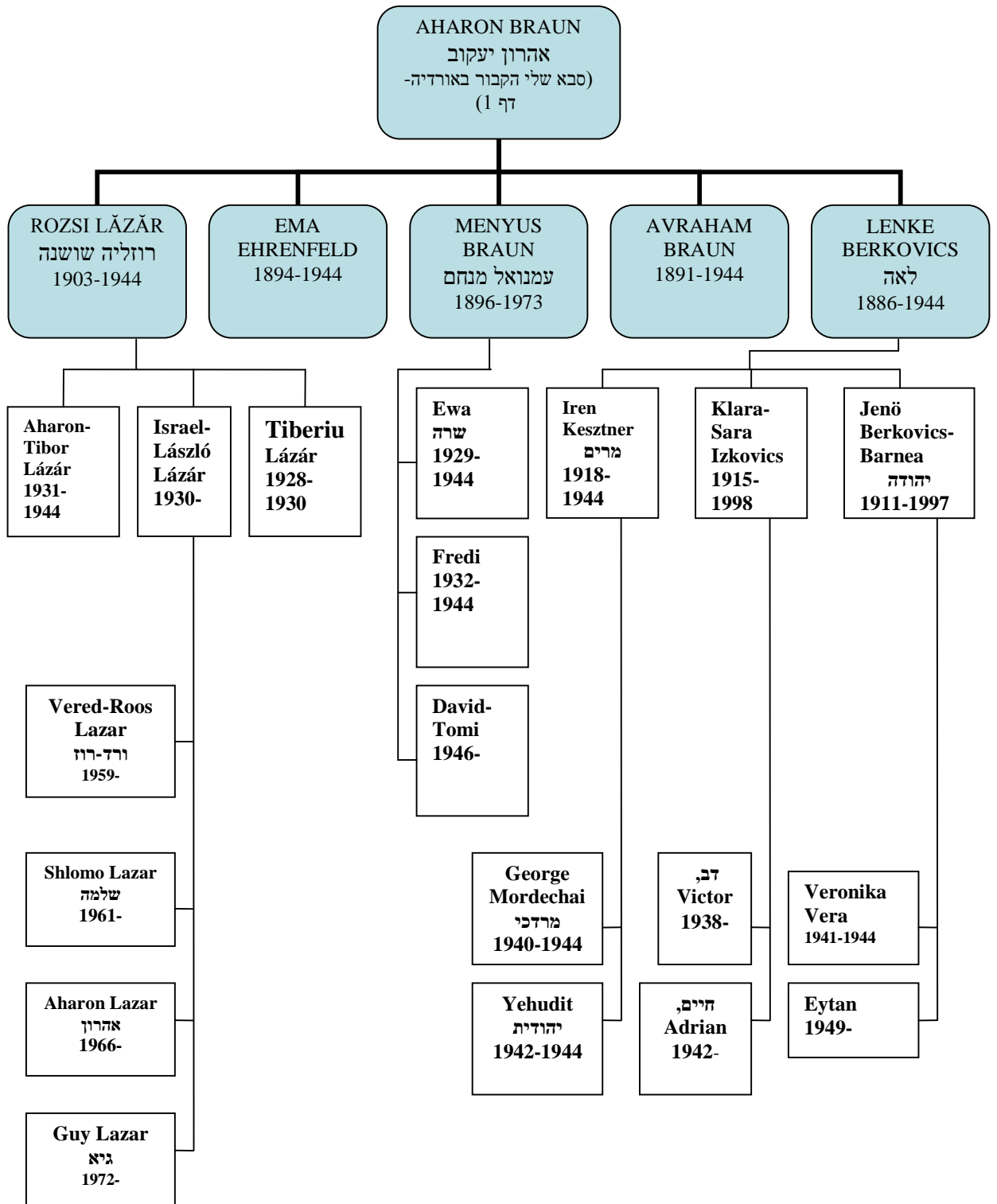


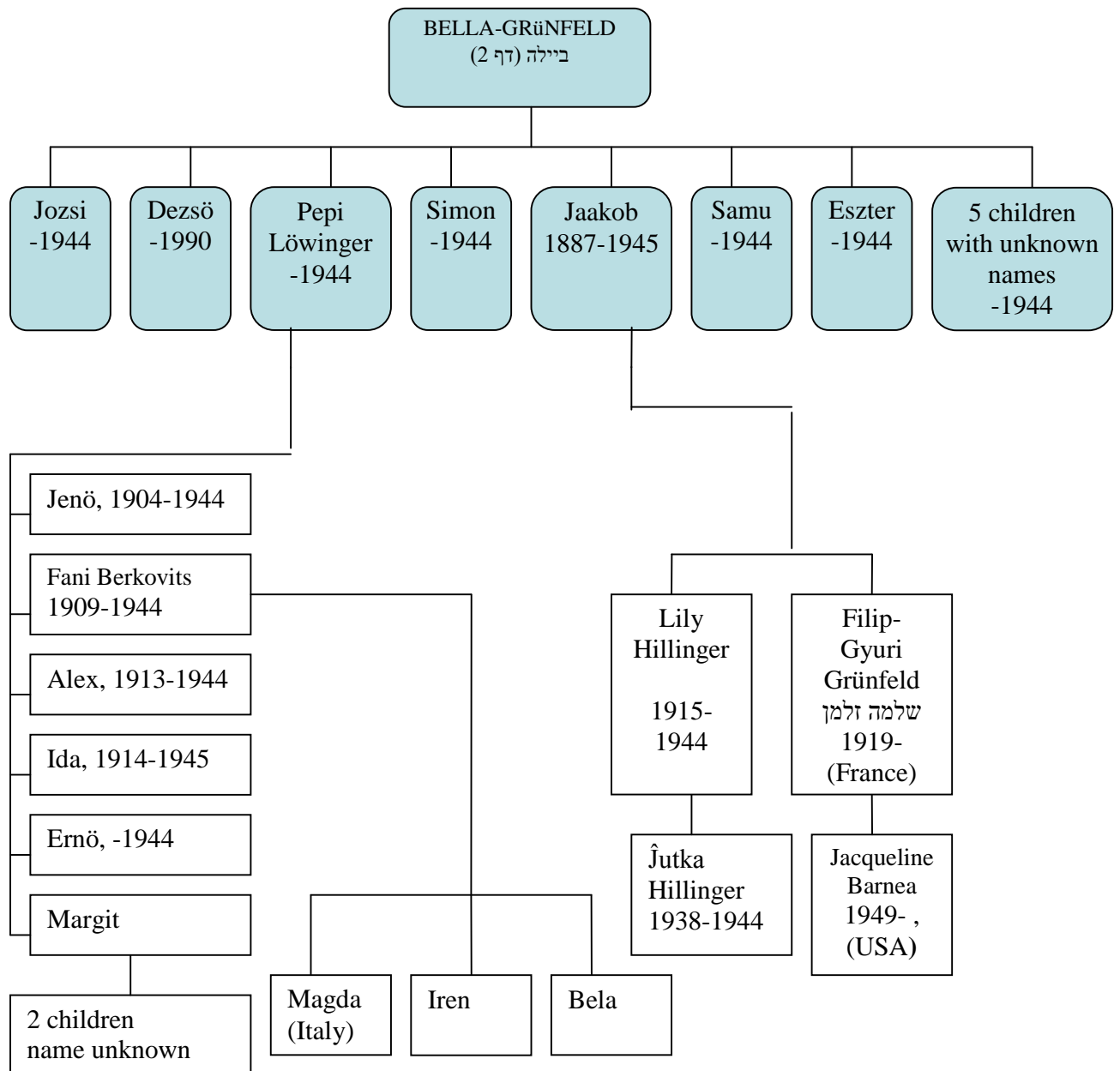
In order to keep it simple, the tree contains only 4 levels and it does not contain partners.

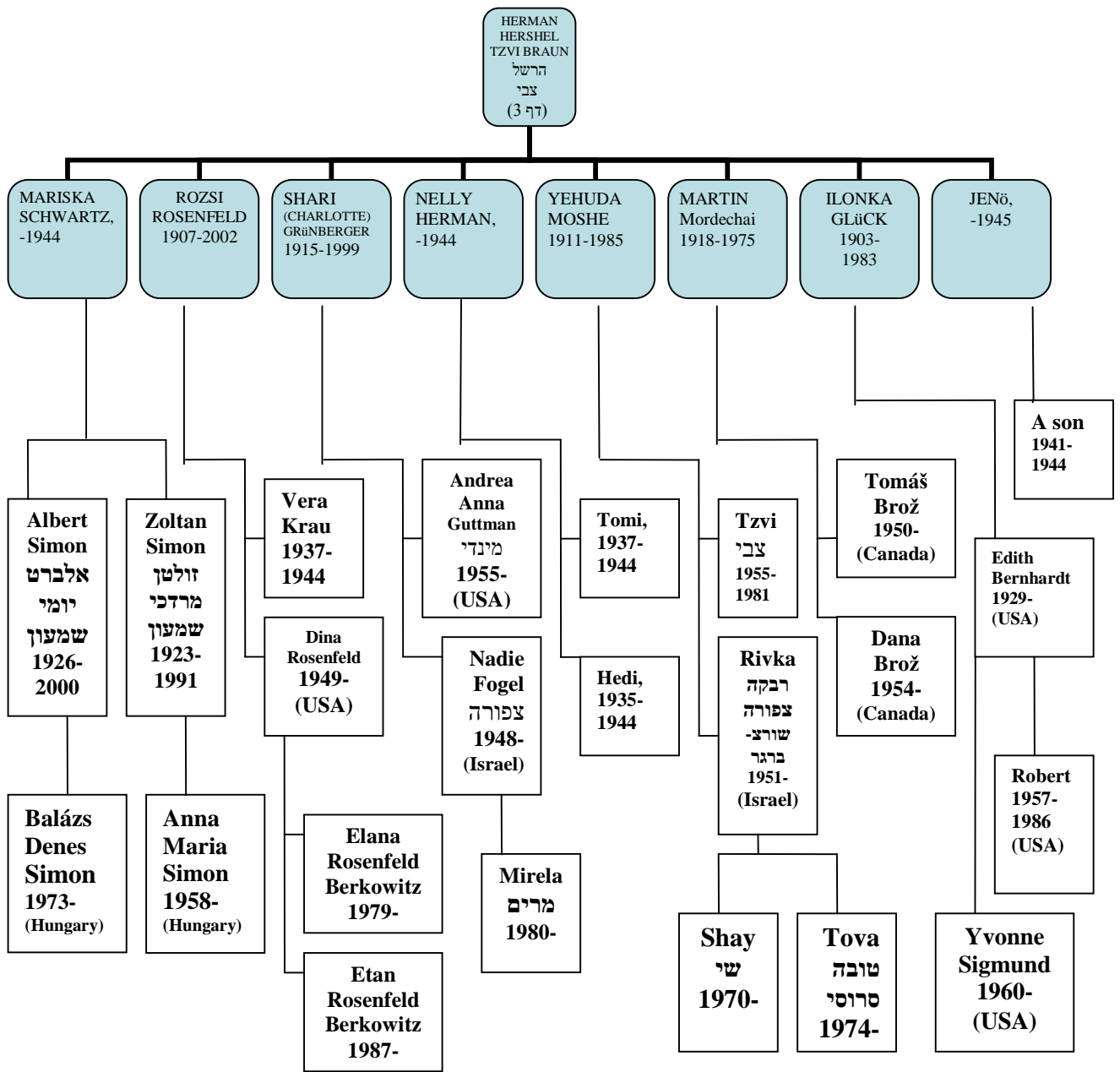
\* Yahuda Moshe Braun was born in Tekeháza (Carpathian Mountains). In 1901 he came to Jerusalem in order to die and be buried there. He died at the age of 85 in the year 1905.





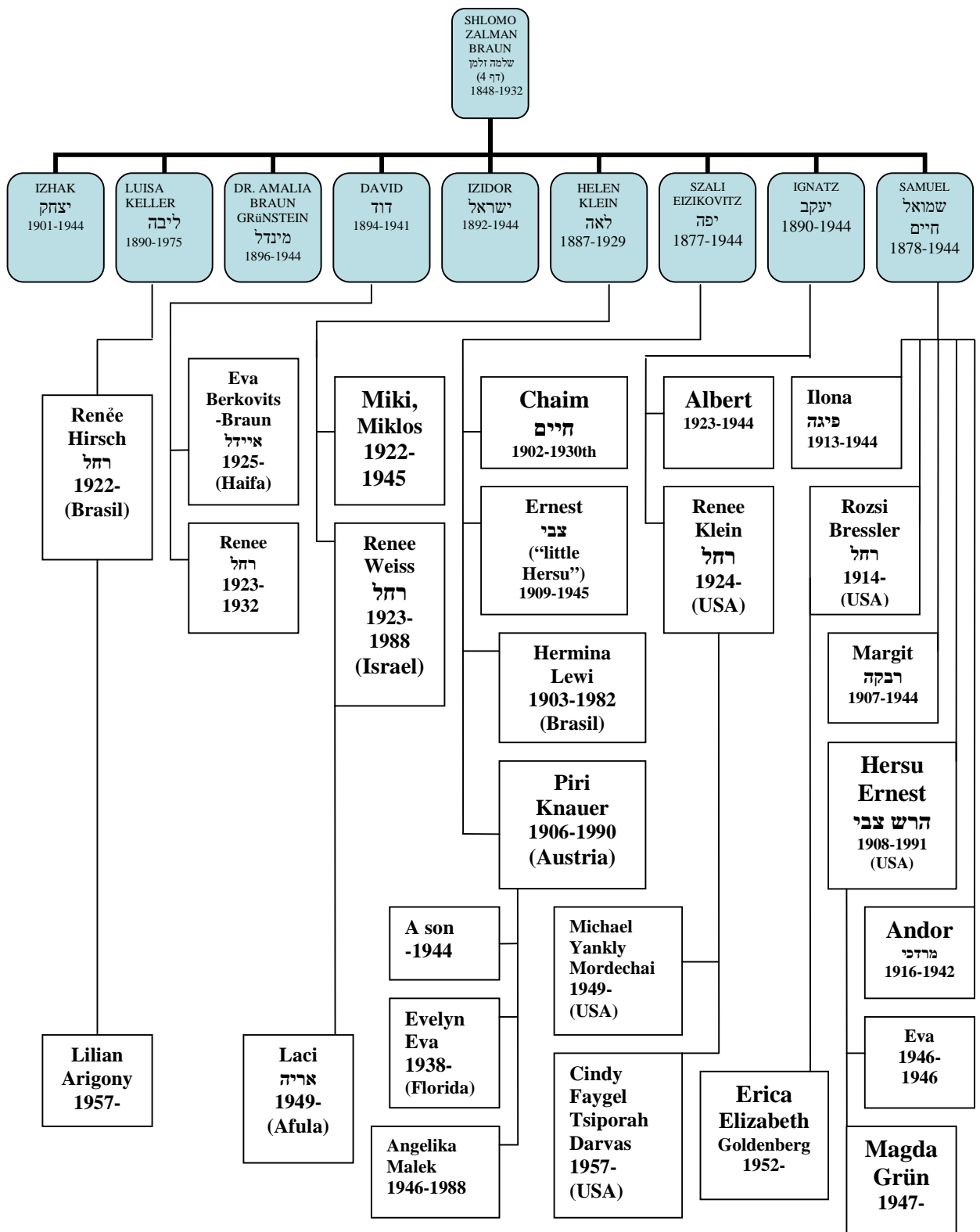
Remarks made by Filip Gyuri Grünfeld:

1. Bella Grünfeld had 12 children. They all lived in Negrest, Transylvania. During the war 11 children died and only Dezsö survived because he was in Rumania. In his last years he lived with his wife in Israel. He had no children.
2. Jaakob Grünfeld was married with Ilona Saidelman. He was taken from Auschwitz to Ghetto Warsaw to clear the destructions. At the end of the war, when the Russian came close, the Germans took him and shot him dead.
3. Pepi Löwinger and her family lived in Oradea (Nagyvárad in Hungarian), Transylvania.
4. Ida, Pepi's daughter, was liberated sick and went to Sweden to recover. She died there from her illness.
5. Margit, Pepi's daughter, converted to Christianity before the war. As a result, she was not sent to the camps. Her children grew up as Christians as well.

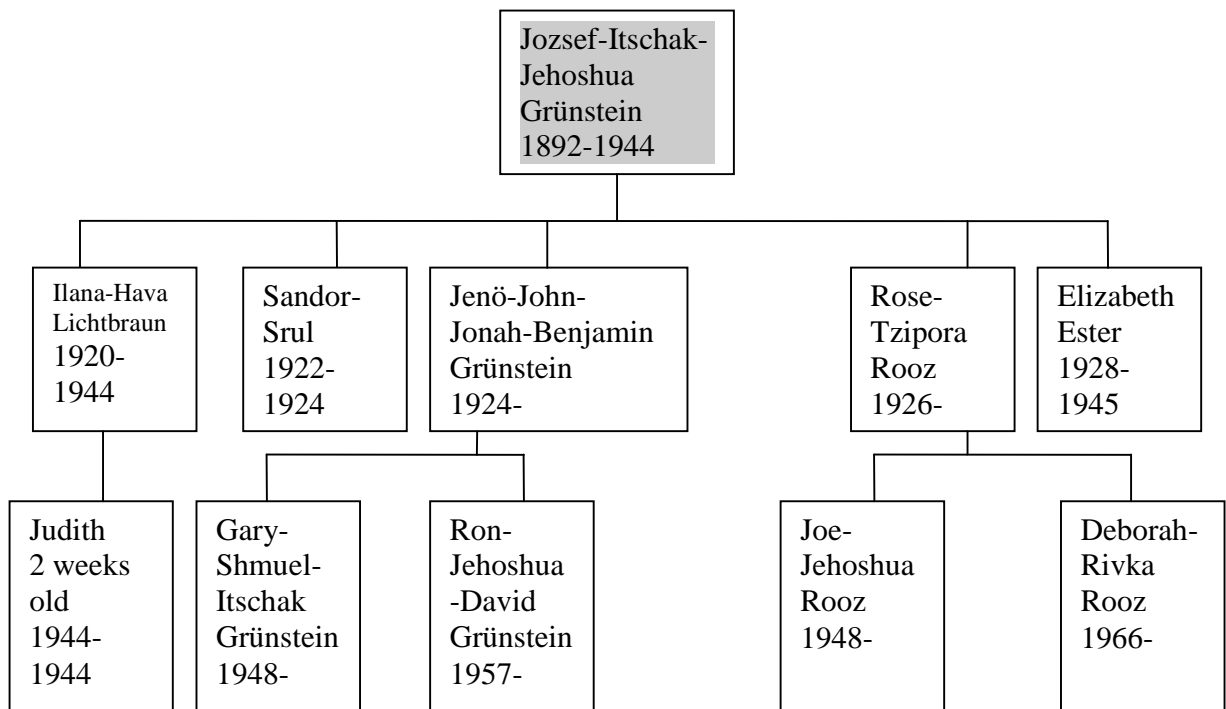

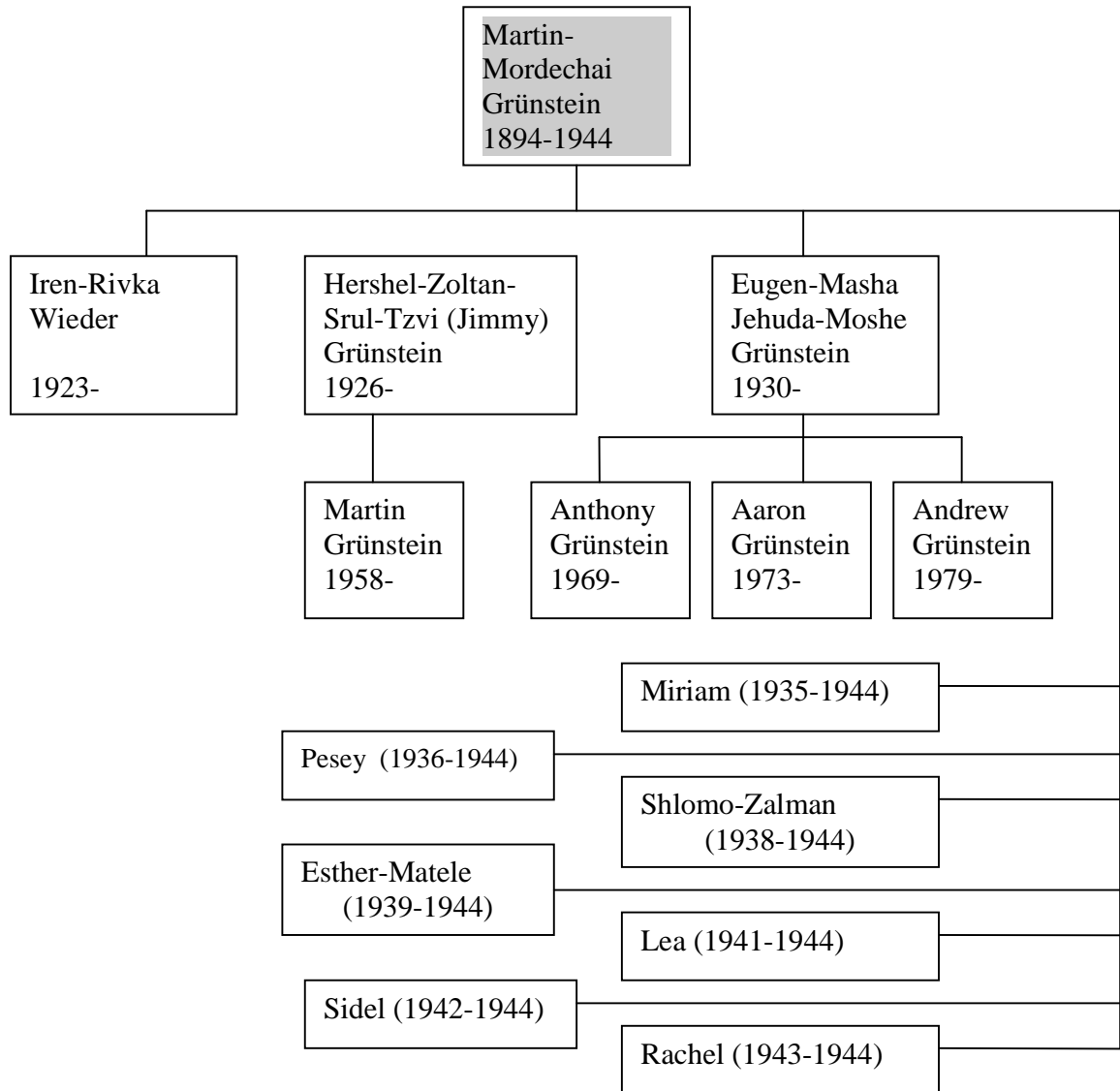

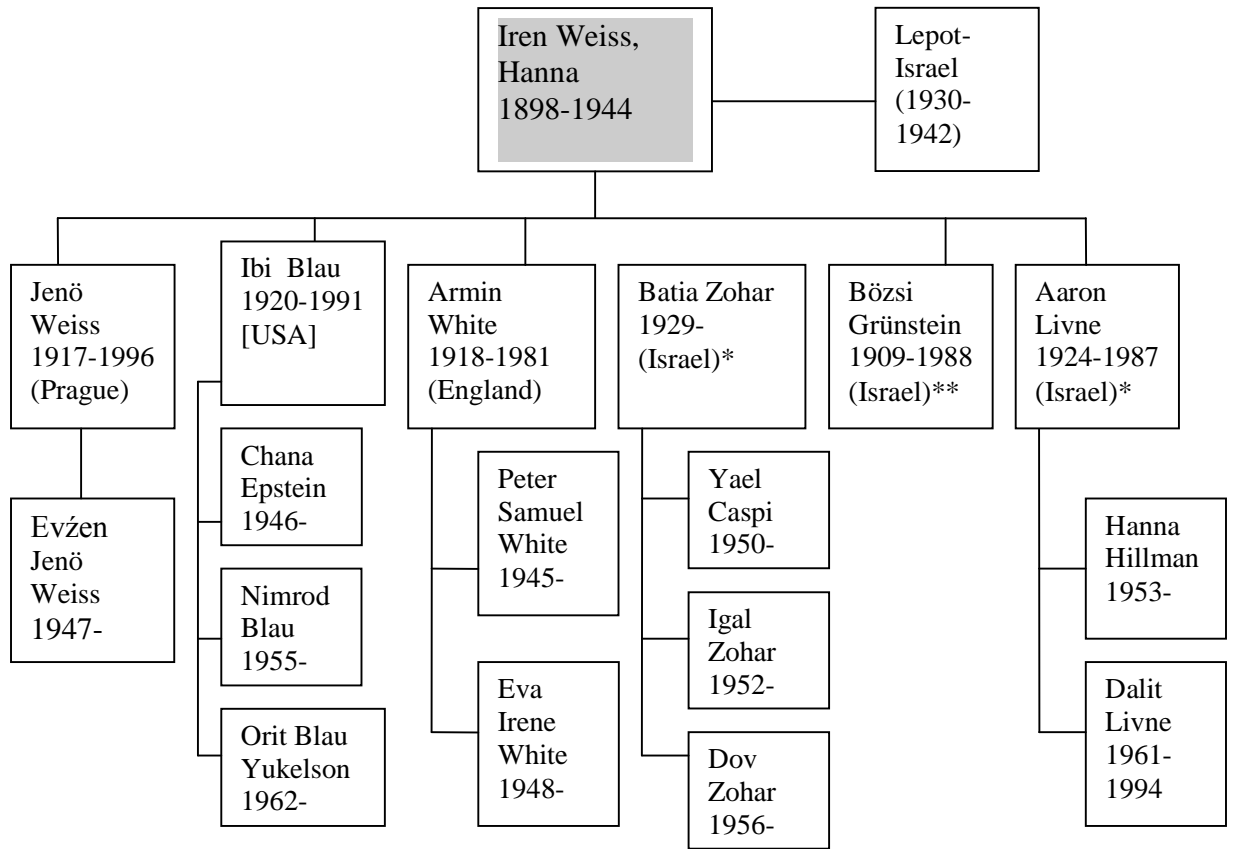
