Dear Kremenets district friends,

We are writing to you today share some news and to ask your help in funding our projects.

A Change in KDRG's Organizational Status

In 2009, KDRG filed articles of incorporation in the state of Oregon in order to be able to collect funds for purposes not then allowed by JRI-Poland (e.g., cemetery restoration). Since then, JRI-Poland's guidelines have broadened, and for the past 15 years, nearly 100% of our contributions have come to us via JRI-Poland. Maintaining a separate incorporation status became an administrative burden with no perceptible benefit. In October 2024, KDRG's Board of Directors voted to drop its incorporation in the state of Oregon--and rely on our affiliation with JRI-Poland for our nonprofit status. The de-incorporation became final in early December. This change will not affect you as a supporter of KDRG and a user of its resources. Our KehilaLinks site, Contributor Site, and help to researchers will continue as before, and procedures for contributing will remain the same.

Unproofed records are available on the KDRG Contributors Site (for those who have donated money or services during the previous two years). Names and towns from all records are searchable in the Kremenets Concordance Database Index. Searching the Concordance is free to all. If you find results that are relevant to your research, we will extract up to 10 records free.

The Concordance now includes 519,170 name-town combinations extracted from documents and other sources relating to the Jews of the Kremenets district. Of the 1,928 towns mentioned, the most common are Kremenets, Vishnevets, Radzivilov, Shumsk, Katerburg, Yampol, Lanovtsy, Vyshgorodok, Belozirka, and Pochayev.
