

1857 Nowogrod Marriage Record, Akt 11 - Szolim Moszk Dawidowicz Baszkiewicz &
Golda Ilowna Krymkiewicz

It happened in the town of Nowogrod on June 28th (June 16, Julian), 1857, at 4 P.M. Orthodox Jew Hersz Pełtinowicz, Acting Rabbi of the Nowogrod District presented himself and stated in the presence of witnesses - Orthodox Jews Joszk Jankielowicz Rozenbaum, a synagogue supervisor*, age 49 and Zelman Abramowicz Grodner, a sexton, age 69, both living in Nowogrod – that before him this day a religious marriage was contracted between Szolim Moszk (2 names) Dawidowicz Baszkiewicz, a bachelor, age 20, *born in the town of Nowogrod* and living there with his parents, the son of Dawid Herszkowicz and Ester Herszkowna, spouses Baszkiewicz and Golda Ilowna Krymkiewicz, a maiden, age 18, born in Nowogrod and living there with her parents, the daughter of Ilo Szlamowicz & Freyda Judkowna, spouses Krymkiewicz, day-laborers. This marriage was preceded by three readings of the banns announced on June 6th, 13th and 20th (May 25, June 1 and June 8, Julian) of the current year in the Nowogrod synagogue at the Sabbath-day gatherings and no impediments to the marriage occurred. The parents of the newlyweds present for the marriage gave their permission for the marriage verbally. The newlyweds stated that they did not contract a premarital agreement. This record was read aloud to the declarants and was signed by the Rabbi and witnesses. The newlyweds stated that they cannot write.
