Jonty Sandler 1950 - 2021

Generous benefactor and Visionary businessman

The passing of my cousin Jonty, following a sudden heart attack in Johannesburg on 4 May 2021, was a great shock. He was just 70 and had so much going for him. He was the son of Archie and Eileen (née Bergman) Sandler. He was born in 1950.

With his international vision and business connections, Jonty travelled abroad regularly. He would often appear at short – or even no notice – at our front door in London. Having him here was always an exciting time as his ideas and imagination were truly mind blowing.

Jonty's wife is Melody They have a son Nathan who lives with his mother in Botswana, while Jonty lived and worked in the Johannesburg area at Ingwenya Country Estate and Farm. They spent a lot of time together before Covid struck. Nathan who is 12, had just spent a month with Jonty on the farm.

Kenneth Kaunda, Jonty and Nathan travelled together to Zambia in April 2021, to celebrate Kaunda's 97th birthday. (in the picture above, Nathan is playing happy birthday to Kaunda on the trumpet, while Jonty sits on the couch talking to the former President of Zambia)

Jonty and Melody (who converted to Judaism) have been staunch members of Temple Israel in Hillbrow, Being a good trumpeter, Nathan also blows the shofar which he did with aplomb at their synagogue in Johannesburg on Rosh Hashanah before Covid struck. (left) Jonty always managed to be with us in London at special times like Loren's wedding – and also just at the time when she passed away. He also happened to be with me at my house when news of his mother Eileen's death came through. We have always been close since I was 11 and he was a baby. My children and grandchildren always enjoyed spending time with Jonty and with Nathan and Melody when they visited us.

Unseen and without fanfare he helped us regularly and not only is his passing a personal tragedy for his family and us, but one of the pillars of our support has fallen away. We remember Nathan's stirring blowing of the Shofar in our shul shortly before Rosh Hashanah two years ago. At the time it was Jonty's wish to join us last year for the High Holy days but because of Covid-19, his plans had to change. What a pity it is that he will now not be able to fulfil that wish.

Jonty was always dedicated to black empowerment. He worked with some of the most important black leaders in South Africa and many areas of Africa. He was project manager and director of many companies and endeavours. He will surely be sorely missed.

Jonty's first professional project was in conjunction with the Krok brothers where he created a kind of 'Mothercare' of shops serving pregnancy and young motherhood

Wild Waters, Boksburg



Jonty then created and built the first water park in South Africa called "Wild Waters" outside Boksburg. It was an innovative and exciting family attraction in the late 70s. There were huge water slides and a wave pool. You could picnic and braai on the lawns beside. I see on the internet that Wild Waters Fun Park, Boksburg is still in operation today.

Shareworld Director and project manager Mar 1981 - Jan 1990 (8 years 11 months)



In the1880s, Jonty raised R30 million to develop 'Shareworld'. The Los Angeles Times wrote this about Shareworld when it opened in 1988: 'On the outskirts of Soweto, rising like a mirage amid ridges of gold-mine refuse, is the first Disneyland-style theme park intended primarily for blacks. Whites, too, are welcome at Shareworld, and a small but steady stream of them have come since the complex opened last November. It is one of the few places in this racially stratified country where white

families can be seen swimming, playing and picnicking in a predominantly black environment. Above is a picture of the first ever wave pool surfing event in South Africa at Shareworld, Johannesburg in 1988.

Shareworld was a concept way ahead of its time, hoping for and enabling Black and White South Africans to share at play, 'growing through education and maturing in partnership' with the dual aim

to help Black South Africans participate in the mainstream of the economy and create an environment where Blacks and Whites could meet each other during the 'dark' days of apartheid. A truly amazing



theme park with restaurants, rides and entertainment hubs a – but being so far before its time in the 1980s, it did not survive.

In the picture above by artist /photographer David Goldblatt we see the new Soccer City stadium above the sad ruins of Shareworld.
