

Who Donated to the Mlynov-Mervits Memorial Plaque in Tel Aviv?

The Fishman family in Baltimore preserved records of these donations in the US to the “Mlynov-Mervitz Society of Israel” in 1955. In 2021, the digitized records and a few photos were sent to me by Ted Fishman, son of Benjamin Fishman and Clara (née Shulman), both born in Mlynov. A photo of this commemorative plaque (below) was among photos preserved in the Fishman family archive. Mlynov family descendant Mark Gelberg, who lives in Israel today, remembers going to commemorations there with his father and other Mlynov born individuals. It is unknown if the memorial is still there.



The Hebrew on the plaque reads:

Yad Vashem [A Memorial and a Name]
to the martyrs
Mlynov
Mervits
and the surrounding areas
beloved and fine
in their lives and in their deaths they were not separated

destroyed and buried alive
on the 28th of Tishrei, 5703 [Friday, Oct. 9, 1942]¹
Remember them, our God, for good
with the other righteous of the world

The exact date of the dedication ceremony is not certain but probably was in the fall of 1955. A passenger manifest from July 1955 shows Gulza Mazer, who appears in the photo of the dedication, leaving New York and heading to Cherbourg France. This was probably the same trip that took her and her sisters to Israel and the dedication ceremony.

Donors and Donations

Included below, for posterity, are copies of the bank records preserved by the Fishman family as well as a handwritten summary list of the people making donations (probably in Ben Fishman's handwriting). The records are of interest historically for descendants who may not know their families were involved in funding the memorial plaque, and in showing the ongoing connection of Mlynov-Mervits immigrants to the US into the 1950s following the Shoah.

The table below follows and transcribes the donor names and donations from the handwritten page in the records. I added a column of notes summarizing what I know or have learned about each of the donors. Some assistance was provided by descendant Joyce Jandorf (née Schuchman) and her family. The order of names in the table follows the handwritten last page of the records with some corrections based on the typed records as well. Many of these family lines are documented on the Mlynov-Mervits website cited above.

| Morris Newman | \$25.00 | Maurice Morris Newman (original surname Iskiewicz) who was born in Mlynov in 1900 and arrived in the US in 1924. |
| Sam Katz | \$10.00 | Probably Samuel Katz, the brother of poet Morris ("Aleph") Katz, born in Mlynov in 1896 who lived in Delaware [Del] |
| Shuchmans | \$10.00 | This is the family of Joseph Schuchman and Jesse (Chissa) (née Klepatch) both from Mlynov. |
| Mr. Rothstein | \$25.00 | Unidentified |

| Beatr. Steinberg | \$50.00 | Beatrice, the eldest daughter of Gedaliah and Rikel Alman (originally Gelman). Born in 1902 in Mervits. Beatrice married a man named Harry Steinberg. |
| Isador Luvisher | \$25.00 | Identified by the Schuchmans as a cousin of their grandmother Jesse (Chissa) Schuchman |
| Sam Katz | \$5.00 | Born David Goldseker in Mlynov about 1904, son of Shimon Goldseker and Anna (Fishman). Brother of Morris Goldseker listed below. Arrived in the US in 1926 via Buenos Aires. |
| Rose Finkelstein | \$10.00 | Demb descendant born in Mlynov in 1899, daughter of Pessie (née Demb) and David Rivitz (aka Hurwitz in America). Arrived in Baltimore in 1909. Sister of Gulza Mazer listed next. |
| Mrs. Gultzie Mazer | \$10.00 | Gulza/ Gulzia Mazer (short for Margalit), Demb descendant, born in Mlynov in 1884. Oldest daughter of Pessie (née Demb) and David Rivitz (aka Hurwitz in America). |
| David Greitzer | \$10.00 | Unidentified |
| Sadie Volinsky [Wolinsky] | \$25.00 | Born Sadie Pincus (Pinchosowicz) in 1898, her mother was Yenta Settleman. Sadie was sister of donor Ely Pincus listed below. Their immigration manifest from 1912 indicates she and her siblings and mother lived in and were born in Mlynov. Her father Beryl appears to have been born in Mervits. |
| Leon Schwartz (Carpel) | \$15.00 | Demb descendant, son of first cousins Paul H. Schwartz and Pepe (née Shulman), both born in Mlynov. "Carpel" was the name of Leon's work which made the donation. Leon was father of Howard Schwartz. |
| Norton Schwartz | \$10.00 | Demb descendant, son of Chaim Schwartz and Yenta (née Demb), brother of Paul H. Schwartz. Arrived in Baltimore in 1912. |
| Mrs. Philip Fraum | \$10.00 | Referring to Clara Fram. Demb descendant born in Mlynov in 1902. Clara was the youngest daughter of Pessie (née Demb) and David Rivitz (aka Hurwitz in America). She arrived in the US in 1909. Sister of Rose Finkelstein and Gulza Mazer listed above. |
| George Steinberg | \$25.00 | Survivor Getzel Steinberg, born in 1907 in Mervits. Survived Mlynov ghetto liquidation with wife Pessia (née Wurtzel) and son Zelig (Gerry) |
| Boruch Meren | \$5.00 | Born in Mlynov in 1908. Son of Ben Tzion Meren and Miriam (née Goldseker), grandson of Hersch Goldseker, migrated to Baltimore in 1940 from Palestine, married Amelia (née Shargel) who was also born in Mlynov |
| I. Kozak | \$5.00 | Icek Kozak, his entire family survived the liquidation of Mlynov ghetto and settled in Philadelphia |
| Frank Setelman [Settleman] | \$20.00 | Frank Settleman (originally Zutelman) born in 1901 in Mervits, arrived in 1923 in Baltimore via Buenos Aires. Brother of Paysee / Paul Shulman listed below and nephew of Ely Pincus and Sadie Wolinsky (née Pincus) who are also contributors. |
| Sarah Berger | \$10.00 | Listed as Sarah "Bergeld (Cal)" on the typed pages. Probably refers to Sarah Sheindel Berger daughter of Ben Zion Berger and Zelda (née Hirsch), one of the Bergers who migrated to Chicago in 1913. She married a man with the surname of Berger as well. She passed away in Beverly Hills, Ca. |
| Ben and Clara [Fishman] | \$10.00 | Refers to Benjamin Fishman, son of Moshe Fishman, and his wife Clara (née Shulman) both from Mlynov. Ben and Clara are in the photo with the donation check. |

| Isadore Lerner | \$25.00 | Also known as Itzik Lerner, son of Joseph Lerner and Rose (née Kuperstein) all from Mlynov. Itzik Lerner assisted his family and two other families migrate to Baltimore in 1920 including Ben Fishman. |
| Joe Fishman | \$10.00 | Son of Nathan Hyman Fishman and Malke Ida. Born in Mlynov in 1884. Cousin of Ben Fishman. Arrived in Baltimore in Aug. 1912, father of Benjamin J. Fishman who married Doris Gruber both from Mlynov. |
| Herman Roskes | \$10.00 | Demb descendant, son of Mollie (née Demb) and Samuel Roskes, arrived in Baltimore in ~1908. His mother was born in Mlynov. |
| Nathan Berger (Cal) | \$25.00 | Son of Ben Zion Berger and Zelda (née Hirsch), brother of Sarah/Sheindel Berger, migrated to Chicago via Baltimore in 1912. Married Rose Steinberg also from Mlynov who was a daughter of Abraham Steinberg and Sarah Hannah (née Shulman) |
| Paul H. Schwartz | \$10 | Demb descendant, born in Mlynov. Son of Chaim Schwartz and Yenta (née Demb). Father of Leon Schwartz. Married his first cousin Pepe Shulman from Mlynov. |
| Ely Pincus | \$20.00 | Full name Chaim Yitzhak Pinchosowicz aka Israel H Pincus in the US. His mother was a Settelman/Zutelman. Brother of Sadie Wolinsky, who also contributed. Their 1912 immigration manifest indicates they lived in and were born in Mlynov. Ely Pincus lived in Philadelphia. |
| S. Schuchman | \$10.00 | Samuel Schuchman, son of Joseph Schuchman and Jesse (née Klepatch) arrived in Baltimore in Nov. 1921 |
| Ben Gilden | \$5.00 | Unidentified. Called Golden on the typed records. |
| Dr. Michel | \$15.00 | Unidentified. Called Dr. Mitchell on typed records |
| Mr. and Mrs. Semiatin | \$15.00 | Theodore Semiatin and his wife Anna (Henye/Chana) (née Fishman). Anna was born in Mlynov, daughter of Nathan Hyman Fischman and Malke. She was a cousin of Ben Fishman. |

| Sam Schwartz | \$5.00 | Samuel "Zavel" Schwartz, born in Mlynov in 1896, son of Michael (aka "Heschie" or "Mischel") and Sheindel Schwartz, arrived in Baltimore in 1912. His daughter, Mildred, married Joseph Lusk. |
| Ger. Goldberg | \$10 | Gershon George "Joe" Goldberg, born in Mlynov in 1896, son of Labish Gelberg and Eta Lea (née Schuchman), arrived in US in 1921, married Sylvia Barditch (whose maternal grandparents were from Mlynov and who was on editorial committee of the Memorial Book) |
| Libby Eistend | \$10 | Survivor Liba Tessler, married name Eistendig, born in Mlynov in 1912, arrived in Baltimore after WWII. |
| Beily Feldman | \$10 | Identity uncertain. Perhaps survivor Sarah Feldman (née Teitelman) from Mervits, daughter of Mordechai Teitelman and Freida (née Horowitz). She married Rabbi Israel Feldman and settled in Wisconsin. |
| Karl Berger | \$25.00 | Born in Mlynov as Kalman Berger in 1906, son of Wolf /Zeev Berger and Golda (possibly née Kentor) arrived in US in 1926 after a stay in Buenos Aires and headed to Chicago. |

| Mr. and Mrs. Fox | \$100 | Samuel Fox and his wife Minnie (née Rivitz/Hurwitz). Minnie was born in Mlynov and was daughter of Pesse (née Demb) and David Rivitz (aka Hurwitz) and sister of Rose Finkelstein and Gulza Mazer. |
| Frank Gittelman | \$25.00 | Listed as from Canada in typed record but not identified. |
| Carl Gaynor | \$10.00 | Born Kalmen Giner/Ganor, son of Elia Aron Giner/Ganor and Leah (née Goldseker) who was from Mlynov. His grandfather was Hersch Goldseker who lived in Mlynov. Karl was possibly born in Dubno and came to US in 1913 and settled in NY. |
| Wasserman | \$10.00 | Listed as B. Wasserman in typed records. Bertha Basia Sklar (née Wasserman), daughter of Rose Wasserman (née Kuperstein) who was born in Mlynov. Rose's sister Radie was married to Joseph Lerner from Mlynov. |
| Sadie Volinsky | \$25.00 | Sadie's name is repeated from column one. It is not clear if she gave two donations or this was simply a repeat of the same record. |
| David Fishman | \$50.00 | Born in Mlynov, son of Moshe Fishman, brother of Benjamin Fishman, married first cousin Eta Goldseker who was also born in Mlynov and daughter of Shimon Goldseker and Anna (née Fishman). David made aliyah from Mlynov 1921, married Eta in the mid-1920s in Palestine and then left for Baltimore in 1929. |
| Morris Goldseker | \$200 | Born in Mlynov, son of Shimon Goldseker and Anna (Fishman) arrived in Baltimore in 1913, became successful real estate investor, left funding for Baltimore Goldseker Foundation upon his death. |
| Pacy Schulman | \$10.00 | Born Pesach Zutelman / Settleman ("Paysee") in Mervits in 1895. Brother of Frank Settleman. He kept the surname of his wife Sarah Shulman, daughter of Tsodik Shulman and Pearl Malka (née Demb), who was born in Mlynov in 1898. Paysee traveled with the Shulman family to Baltimore in 1921. |
| Simon Schulman | \$5.00 | Demb descendant, Shimon Shulman, son of Tsodik Shulman and Pearl Malka (née Demb). Born in Mlynov in 1890. Brother of Harry Shulman, Sarah Shulman, Clara Fishman and Pepe Schwartz. Came to Baltimore in 1922. |
| Harry and Yetta Shulman | \$10.00 | Demb descendant, Harry "Hertz" Shulman, son of Tsodik Shulman and Pearl Malka (née Demb). Brother of Simon "Shimon" Shulman, Sarah Shulman, Clara Fishman and Pepe Schwartz. Came to Baltimore in 1921 with his parents and siblings. |

¹ Writers in the memorial book for Mlynov-Mervits and descendants in the US and Israel give slightly different dates for the liquidation in early October 1942: October 8th (pp. 273), October 9th (=28th of Tishrei) (p. 47) Yosef Litvak (p. 47) recalls the date as the 28th of Tishrei 1942 which was October 9, 1942, though Litvak gives the date apparently mistakenly as August 7, 1942. The Steinberg family survivors who went to Israel also recalled the date of liquidation as October 9, 1942. (See *A Struggle to Survive*, p. 29 footnote, by Shoshana (Upstein) Baruch. The Steinberg family in the US commemorated the date as the 29th of Tishrei, which was October 10, 1942. Itzik Kozak identified Oct. 1st as the day they learned that graves were being prepared (p. 356) while Shaulik Halperin identified October 10th as the date they learned the ditches were being dug (p. 352). In David Sokolsky's book, *Monument: One Woman's Courageous Escape from the Holocaust*, 3rd ed. (pp. 1–2) the survival story of Liba Tesler (his step-grandmother), David quotes Liba as identifying October 8 as the liquidation date, 3 days after her October 5 birthday. – HS

² Based on looking at other photos, and feedback from the Herman descendants, I believe that two women may have been confused in the labeling of this photo. I believe the woman labelled Maltza Herman in the front right was actually Gulza Mazer and that the woman labelled Gulza Mazer in the back row was Maltza Herman.

Rules Governing Savings Deposits

1. Every person applying shall have the privilege of depositing any sum of money not less than one dollar. Guardians may deposit for the benefit of their wards, by order of the Court. Trustees may deposit in their own names as such, but without specifying the name of the party for whom it is held, or the nature of the trust; and parents or others may deposit in the name of any child or children, and make such deposit subject to their own or children's order; and minors may deposit in their own names and subject to their own order.
2. Depositors shall have the right to withdraw their deposits at any time by giving one month's notice in writing of their intention. Not more than one thousand dollars can be withdrawn in any one month, but this notice and provision may be dispensed with, in the discretion of the President or any Vice President of the Trust Company and the same be paid on demand. The

by mail, accompanied by Cashier's Check in case of withdrawals. In all such cases, the Bank will not be responsible for losses in the mails.

If the Bank Book be lost or stolen, immediate written notice should be given to the Bank, and notice of the loss should be duly published, the cost of such publication to be paid by the depositor. The Officers of the Bank may, in their discretion, require a bond of indemnity satisfactory to them, before issuing a duplicate Bank Book for the amount of the deposit or before making any payments out of the deposit.

Possession of the Bank Book may be treated by the Bank as sufficient evidence of ownership thereof to authorize the payment of money due thereon. The Bank will endeavor to prevent fraud on its depositors, yet all payments made by the Bank to any person producing the Bank Book shall be valid as against the depositor and a full and effectual release thereof to the Bank, unless and until the Bank shall have received from the depositor written notice not to make such payment.

All accounts of depositors are subject to provisions of such laws of the State of Maryland regarding dormant accounts as may now or hereafter be in effect.

All accounts of depositors in which no deposits or withdrawals have been made, and the Bank Book has not been presented for the entry of interest earned, for a period of ten years, shall cease to be entitled to interest after ten years from the date of the last transaction.

GENERAL

The Bank reserves the right to change its Rules and Regulations, including the rate of interest to be paid on savings deposits, on thirty days' notice posted at its Main Office and each of its Branches, and such changes when made shall be binding upon the depositor.

The acceptance of the Bank Book shall constitute an acknowledgment on the part of the depositor of notice of these Rules and Regulations and his agreement to be bound thereby.

RECORD OF DONATIONS
