Because our people were historically unparalleled wanderers, it is difficult to pinpoint a real "hometown" or fixed place of origin for them after our exile from Israel in 70 CE. There are differing theories as to when Jews reached eastern Europe; some say they arrived in the first century CE as prisoners of the Roman 15th legion¹ and others late-date Jewish settlement to the mid-18th century².

Recent generations (from the 1910s) of this particular Deutsch family were born, for the most part, in the villages and towns of the Carpathian region ("Karpato-Rus"), now western Ukraine and north Hungary. Amongst these villages, Velke Berezne (Nagy Berezne, Velikiy Bereznyy) was, along with several other Ukrainian towns, significant as the place of birth of many Deutsch holocaust victims and current survivors. Of the 7 children of Herman Deutsch and Ester Mittelman (born 1853-1869 in Dubrava, Slovakia) at least two settled in "Berezne" and others, such as the Ladomirov branch, came there for education. The following map shows the dispersion of the family to various villages, including Velikiy Bereznyy. Separate descendancy charts for each offspring follow.


